

Do not cause anyone to stumble, whether Jews, Greeks or the church of God—even as I try to please everyone in every way. For I am not seeking my own good but the good of many, so that they may be saved. 11 1 Follow my example, as I follow the example of Christ."

1 Corinthians 10:33-11:1

Conflict can be hard. In our families. In our workplaces. Even in our church. It cannot just ruin a day or a week. Conflict can often balloon into something we have no control over. If left unchecked, it can often define years of our lives. "I left that job because of him." "I don't talk to that side of the family." "I can't be in the same room as her."

Conflicts in families can often come up during the holiday season. I have even heard someone say, "We can't spend time with that side of the family without somebody leaving in tears or slamming the front door." As your pastor, I want to encourage you to approach conflict as a Christian.

Many Christians who practice and write on Christian conflict reconciliation say the first response they always get when they bring up faith during conflict is "Oh, you want me to be a nice guy? A doormat? A pushover?" Not exactly. There is more to conflict reconciliation than just giving people what they want. Oftentimes, that is exactly the problem.

Instead, understanding conflict from a Christian perspective comes down to three things: seeing conflict as an opportunity (1) to glorify God, (2) to serve your neighbor, and (3) to grow into the image of Christ. Christians do not let conflict control their lives. They know conflict is a result of sinfulness. Therefore, conflict of an opportunity. Not to experience pain and sorrow, but to overcome it by following God's plan for our lives.

If you are interested in conflict reconciliation on your life, I encourage you to take some time to talk with Pastor Jason or myself. And I also recommend a book I've found very helpful on the topic: *The Peacemaker* by Ken Sande.

God's blessings on your holiday season. I pray that the peace of Christ reigns in your home, and that you are instruments of God's grace this holiday season. In addition, do remember you're invited to our Christmas open house this year!







All boxes collected at St James will go to Aurora, Illinois for processing and shipping. Again, a huge THANK YOU to everyone, single person and family who contributed.
