
St. Martin Lutheran Church and School is people who have gathered together under the cross of Jesus Christ to glorify His Name and extend His Kingdom.

#### Message from our Senior Pastor ~

## It's Always Time For Thanksgiving

"Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth. Sing to the Lord, praise his name; proclaim his salvation day after day. Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous deeds among all peoples. For great is the Lord and most worthy of praise; he is to be feared above all gods." Psalm 96:1-4

The Thanksgiving season is upon us even though some stores are already filling up with Christmas items. Traditionally, Thanksgiving gives us a little time to recall all the blessings which have been given to us. We do have many things to be thankful for, including house and home, spouse and family, jobs and friends, and many other wonderful blessings. As a church family we also have so much to grateful for, especially saving faith by a Savior who has given us life everlasting through His own life, death, and resurrection.

The text above, and the following verses in Psalm 96, reminds us to have thankful hearts 365 days of the year. #### Message from our Associate Pastor ~

I was listening to professor of theology Jordan Daniel Wood a few days ago. I've followed his work for a couple of years—we share a few research interests. But he was recently giving a talk on how his time as a stay-at-home dad while he finished his research was helpful for his work as an academic theologian. Specifically, it helped him understand God's relationship to us as our Father better. God loves his children. He cares for us. God knows what it takes to get something through to us.

Each child is different. As a father of four, I know that certain methods of discipline, certain ways of speaking, certain ways of engaging with my kids, are helpful for some, but not helpful for others. If I want to help my children grow, I have to take the time to know what each one of them is like; I have to know them personally. This is exactly what God does with each of us. While a lot of the themes and goals are the same, God loves each of us uniquely, and has a relationship with each of us.

One of the offerings we're going to have here at St. Martin is a parenting class. It will also be a time for parents to share the task of parenting in community with one another. As I work through the material, I'm excited to learn more about how to parent, and to share that with the families of our congregation and community; to give us all time together to speak about parenting, learning how to parent, and support each other as we all learn (myself included) how to parent.

If you want to support that ministry, start praying for its success, and if you or someone you know would benefit from joining us, be on the lookout for more updates! We'll be using the book *Parenting: Getting It Right* by Andy and Sandra Stanley, which Bekah and I have read a few times.

#### Message from our Principal

With the start of school, some parents and children worry about the friendships they will make. I found a great article about this and ways you can assist your child in developing good friendships. Here is the article written by <u>Suzanne Gosselin</u> with In Touch Ministries.

Friends play an important role in your child's social, emotional, and spiritual development. And <u>1</u> Corinthians 15:33 is clear about the consequences of bad friends: "Do not be deceived: 'Bad company ruins good morals.' So how can parents **help** their children make good friends? Here are four ways to start:

- 1. **Pray for good friends for your child.** Many Christian parents pray for their child's future spouse—but before a husband or wife enters the picture, dozens of other friends and relationships will shape your child. Pray that God will provide godly friends for your child to encourage her in her faith.
- 2. **Build character that chooses good friends.** As you help your child grow to value faithfulness, goodness, peace, and other fruit of the Spirit in their own lives, they will naturally be attracted to others with these qualities.
- 3. **Teach them not to settle.** In middle school, my best friend was a neighbor girl who constantly ditched me for better offers and verbally tore me down for not being cool enough. Every day my mom counseled me, through my tears, reminding me that this "friend" didn't recognize my value and that she was not a true friend. Eventually, I found other friends and had less and less time for this toxic relationship.
- 4. **Do a friendship study.** If your child is having friend problems, such as dealing with a bad friend or not having any friends, look up these verses from Proverbs together and talk about what makes a good friend. After reading the passages, talk about qualities you've each appreciated in friends you've had in the past.
  - <u>Proverbs 17:17</u>
  - Proverbs 13:20
  - Proverbs 18:24
  - Proverbs 27:17

Helping your child think through the purpose and importance of friends in his life can help him make better friends. Remind him that the first step to making the right kind of friend is *being* the right kind of friend. When he is kind, friendly and takes an interest in what others have to say, people will be more likely to want to strike up a friendship. And, of course, his best friend Jesus promises to always be with him—"a friend who sticks closer than a brother" (Prov. 18:24).

The consequences of shallow thankfulness

Can you imagine a Thanksgiving dinner without turkey, mashed potatoes, gravy and pumpkin pie? I know I can't! To not have these on the menu, or worse, to run out of them with the family around the table, would be a culinary sin of epic proportions. An attempt to serve bratwurst and hamburgers in place of the standard fare would ring hollow and seem totally inappropriate and out of place. It isn't that the food would be bad; brats and burgers are pretty tasty. But not for Thanksgiving — they just don't go together!

This month, as we continue to walk through the stewardship hymn, "Forgive Us, Lord, for Shallow Thankfulness" (LSB 788), we turn our attention to verse three. Here, William Watkins Reid, Sr., the man who penned this text, draws attention to some things that do not go along with faithful, thankful stewardship.


Forgive us, Lord, for selfish thanks and praise ...

We see this often with small children. They greedily snatch the candy out of a grandparent's hand, savagely destroy the wrapper, and attempt to stuff the entire delicacy in their mouth in one bite, only to have a parent say, "Tell grandma thank you." This is followed by the pro forma thanks that is uttered between chocolate chews. It isn't really thankfulness; it is simply checking a box to keep mom or dad off their backs.

Forgive us when our thanks are shallow, O Lord! In this month of Thanksgiving, grant us the grace to offer heaping helpings of this stewardship so that others may see Jesus!

THERE IS STILL TIME TO PACK A SHOEBOX FOR OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD!

Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse where shoeboxes are filled with gifts and delivered to children in need around the world. These gift-filled boxes are often the first gift some of these children will receive.

Anyone can pack a shoebox--individuals, families, students, and other groups--with fun toys (such as soccer balls, dolls, or cars), school supplies, and hygiene items. Take a list of suggested gifts from brochure holder on the table. In



addition to the gifts, each box costs \$10 to ship. You may donate \$10 with your box, but we also will be collecting monetary donations from those who cannot pack a box either through special donation or the door offering. September, October, and November Chapel offerings will also be used to offset the cost of shipping these wonderful gift-filled shoeboxes.

This is not just a gift-giving project, but is also a discipleship project. With each box we send, Operation Christmas Child put a special book about Jesus in each child's box in their own language. They are told about Jesus when they receive their boxes, and then are invited to a discipleship class, The Greatest Journey, where they learn Bible stories and memorize Scripture verses. At the end of the course, each child receives a New Testament Bible that also includes some Old Testament stories, a dictionary of Biblical terms, and a map of Bible lands. This is often the first copy of God's Word that they children or their families will own. Having learned God's Word, they then can share it with family and friends, so many lives are changed through our shoebox gifts!

Please turn in your gift-filled shoeboxes to the table in the church sanctuary **no later than November 17th.** The Blessing of the Shoeboxes will be held during the chapel service on Wednesday, November 20th. After the blessing, students help load the boxes and your special gifts in a shoebox begin their journey to a special child.
